

# COMMON ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SAFETY

Shared Ski Adventures include adventurous and exhilarating outdoor activities.

The natural & man-made elements and equipment a part of Shared Ski
Adventures (SSA) result in inherent risks of participation. Common to all ski and
snowboard experiences these risks can result in serious or fatal injury. To ensure
safety of your participant and yourself the SSA "SMART Code" is a great tool to
reference when instructing skiing and/or snowboarding

#### S - Skier first

- > Use students strengths and build from there
- > It is your skier's/boarder's lesson, you are the passenger
- > Safety: Focus is always be on student's safety

## M - Make a plan

- > For every lesson, run and movement
- > ALWAYS communicate with your student

## A - Adaptability

- > Understand individual needs change and be flexible
- > Equipment is to help learn skills not replace them

#### R - Respect

- > Student needs and goals are the priority over instructor's ambitions
- > The focus is abilities NOT disabilities

#### T - Take it Easy

> Have fun together! No pressure, just support

#### In the case of an emergency (Student and Instructor)

- 1. Stay with the individual who needs care
- 2. Make sure your student is safe & supervised
- 3. Notify Ski Patrol Immediately
- 4. Notify an SSA Coordinator ASAP so they can notify parent/caregiver/emergency contact
- 5. An accident report will need to be filled out once everyone is safe or in good hands
- 6. Follow up with SSA Coordinator in case of any post incident needs

### **Specific Equipment Safety**

#### Sit Ski Safety

- ALWAYS...
  - · Ski within your ability and participants comfort
  - Ensure you as an instructor are tethered (attached) to the sit ski when assisting a skier.
  - Check pin, bindings, straps and belt after each run
  - Communicate with your fellow instructors (transfers, lifts, safety and terrain)
  - Check often that the student is not too cold, your student in the sit ski will get cold much sooner than you
  - Sit Skis are not to go on terrain above a blue WITHOUT APPROVAL FROM AN SSA COORDINATOR. This is in the best interest of the students' comfort and safety.

## Slider Safety

- Sliders are used to make large and wide turns and therefore should be used on wide terrain
- Sliders are <u>ONLY</u> to be used on <u>green</u> terrain
